# 2. Minutes of the Meeting on 19 December 2024:

The Council's Chief Arboriculturist, Craig Sinclair will be attending a meeting arranged for Thursday 30 January at 7pm in Murieston Village Hall to give an update and answer questions, specifically regarding the restoration of the woodland on the west side of Easter Bankton which had been destroyed in the storm on 21 January and will also cover maintenance of the Linhouse Trail etc.

St John's Scotland will be running a CPR training session for the community at Murieston Village Hall on Monday 3 February at 7pm. St John's staff will demonstrate CPR and use of a defibrillator, and then let people practice on demonstration mannequins. Everyone is welcome to attend the session.

lan Brown has had a response from West Lothian Council about vehicles parking illegally (i.e. outside parking bays) at the station. The council can take no action and it is a matter for the police. The Roads Service will raise this with the police as there have been repeated incidents. There are no plans to change the boxed junction area or parking, or increase parking capacity.

Full fibre broadband was due to be installed by Openreach at the end of December but has been delayed until further trenching work is undertaken.

A regular robotics workshop for children aged 7 to 11 is starting on Saturday.

Murieston Initiative has opted to take a two year lease when the current support from West Lothian Council is withdrawn in 2026. The management committee with Murieston Community Development Trust are developing plans to continue running the Hall and build a replacement community centre when funds are available. A key factor in making the future of the Hall financially viable is the provision of road access and parking at the Hall.

There are no new significant planning applications affecting Murieston.

Creation of a soil bund for Murieston Tennis & Sports Club at Cricket Club (ref. 0934/FUL/24) The developer of the new tennis courts has submitted a planning application in retrospect to create a soil bund beyond the perimeter of the cricket pitch from soil excavated during the building of the new tennis courts. The Planning Service has asked for the developer to submit a new contaminated land remediation report. The developer will need to conduct a soil sample analysis of the bund.

### Local Development Plan 2 (LDP2)

The Planning Service has written to invite evidence engagement from stakeholders as the first stage of preparing the new LDP2 to set out the evidence base in an Evidence Report. We are invited to make submissions to the engagement on the draft topic schedules. Ian will ask whether a separate Evidence Engagement Response Form has to be used for each item / comment. Responses to the engagement on the draft topic schedules are required by 28<sup>th</sup> February. The Call for Ideas for development proposals will then follow afterwards.
